MINUTES

PUBLIC HEALTH

a. Resolution: Authorization to Contract with Geneva General Hospital and Soldiers and Sailors Hospital – 2020-2021

Supervisor Rich Russell motioned to approve the contract with Geneva General Hospital and Soldiers and Sailors Hospital. Supervisor Tamara Hicks seconded the motion. The motion carried.

c. Informational: Coroner Report 2018

Ms. Beer reviewed the coroner's report presented to committee. They will be meeting with the coroners and Dr. Long separately this week. With the anticipation of Dr. Dean retiring they are look at contracting with a new Doctor. There were a few less cases last year due to less overdues. She will also bring back options to committee on transports.

d. Performance Management

Ontario County's work for the accreditation is completed and upload they are just waiting on a few other counties. Everything must be submitted in March and they plan on doing that within the next two weeks.

e. Updates

The 2020 Chose Health Ontario award will be awarded to Geneva Reads. This will be given out at the Safety Council Awards dinner in March.

CoVid-19 (Coronavirus) One person is self-isolating after coming thru Canada. Currently there are no confirmed cases in NY.

The flu cases last week are down. It's believed that the flu season has now peaked.

There are a few Canandaigua residents that have been asking to have the fluoride taken out of the drinking water. They will be holding a meeting on March 10th regarding this.

MENTAL HEALTH

a. Updates

Ms. Johnston reported that Jessica Mitchell has been selected to become the new Deputy Mental Health Director.

Ms. Johnson informed the committee that she is still looking at to add a raise the age social worker. This social worker will be working with the raise the age teens and some other clinical kids. Another social worker will also be added for kids dealing with trauma that will be funded with a grant through the DA's office. The Child Advocacy Center was

recently given a grant to provide certificate training for people that work with kids dealing with trauma. She will be sending staff to this training. FLACRA is going to be applying for an intergraded license to be able to treat people with mental illness and substance abuse together.

OFFICE FOR THE AGING

*a. **Resolution:** Authorization to Accept Age Friendly Planning Grant – Planning Department and Office for the Aging*

Supervisor Fred Wille motioned to approve the acceptance of the age friendly planning grant. Supervisor Daryl Marshall seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Ms. Coveny noted that a transportation study was completed last year. With the information from this study they are looking at being able to provide more medical transports for medical appointment. They would like to do this through mobility management; that is coordinated through a One Click One Trip planning interface software. Livingston County has already implemented this software and it is working well. They are also looking at Uber Health. There is 5310 grant funding for this program, this is currently being researched.

DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES

*a. **Updates***

Ms. Tiberio reports quarterly to the State the homelessness numbers for the County. In January our single numbers surged to 95 from 65-70. They have an individual auditing people that are being housed temporarily, and increased screening is being advocated for. They are working with homeless people eligible for the subsidized housing funding the first of March. Staffing for all not for profits and county staff are down. They are already scheduling a new test, and due to the staffing challenges overtime will be increasing. On a better note, as of December 31st they were down to 49 children in foster care from a high of 95 in 2014.

YOUTH BUREAU
