The meeting of the Public Safety Committee was called to order at 11:00 am by Supervisor Green.

MINUTES

Supervisor Campbell made a motion to approve the minutes of the Public Safety Committee meeting from April 29, 2020. Supervisor Menikotz seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PUBLIC HEALTH

Update

Public Health Director, Mary Beer, gave the following COVID19 updates:

- 11 new cases
- 174 positive cases since March
- 9 in the hospital and out of those, three were employees of the latest outbreak in the nursing home in Elm Manor
- 164 in quarantine
- 76 recovered
- She is concerned the cases she is seeing in the community are health care workers.
- A small outbreak in DDSO in Victor
- Same instructions on social distancing, washing hands and masks

CAMPBELL COMMISSION

Supervisor Todd Campbell said the Campbell Commission met last week via WebEx. Supervisor Campbell gave the following update:

- Raise the Age, discussion on the lack of secure detention facilities
- There is a reduced number of beds available for DSS placement, noting some people are pulling back and saying they will only take people they know or family members.
- Criminal Justice Reform; traffic discovery numbers are up
- Treatment Courts are being done via Webex
- Weekend Alternative has not been held since March
- Electronic home monitoring has been busy
- Trust Accounts are still active
- Lengthy discussions about the courts, the court system and what that might look like as courts start to open up
- Youth Court is going well
- Jail population is relatively low

PLANNING

Betsy Landre presented an invoice from Finger Lakes Communications for approval to pay for the purchase of five mobile radio units.

Supervisor Campbell motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Venuti. Motion carried.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

a. **Resolution:** *Authorization to Extend FY 1819 Recruitment and Retention Grant Program through March 31, 2021*

Jeff Harloff presented a resolution to extend a recruitment and retention grant program.

Supervisor Daryl Marshall motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Bendzlowicz. Motion carried.

b. **Addendum Resolution:** *Proclamation – Emergency Medical Services Week – May 17-23, 2020*

Jeff Harloff presented a resolution to recognize the emergency medical services people in our community. He noted this service has only been around for fifty years. He gave a brief history of its duties and the changes through each decade.

Supervisor Bendzlowicz motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Menikotz. Motion carried.

a. **Resolution:** *Recognizing National Law Enforcement Week 2020*

Undersheriff Frasca presented a resolution recognize May 10-May 15, 2020 as National Law Enforcement Week in 2020.
