### CALL TO ORDER

The meeting of the Public Safety Committee was called to order at 11:00 a.m. by Chairman Green.

### MINUTES

Supervisor Bendzlowicz made a motion to approve the minutes of the Public Safety Committee meeting from June 13, 2018. Supervisor Westbrook seconded the motion. The motion carried.

### CAMPBELL COMMISSION

Supervisor Campbell pointed out the following:

- The last meeting was on June 28<sup>th</sup>; due to the Holiday, attendance was low.
- Fourteen individuals were in for the weekend alternative program
- Four individuals were in the electronic home monitoring program
- The Crisis Intervention Team update has come back
- Sheriff Povero gave update on the Law Enforcement Advisory Board
- Centralized Arraignment review will be coming out in August
- There was discussion in regards to the coroner report
- There was discussion in regards to making overdoses as recordable

### PLANNING DEPARTMENT

- ♦ *Resolution: Award of Bid  
Weissco Power-  
Purchase/Install  
Uninterruptable Power Supply  
Batteries (CP 10-2017)*

Supervisor Bendzlowicz motioned to approve the Award of Bid B18065 to Weissco Power LLC for the purchase and installation of uninterruptable power supply batteries for the Mary Street 700 MHZ Capital Project. Supervisor Campbell seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Supervisor Venuti motioned to approve as a block the payments to Federal Engineering and Harris Corp. Supervisor Campbell seconded the motion. The motion carried.

**OFFICE OF SHERIFF**

- ◆ *Resolution: Award of Contract-Finger Lakes Communications for Service/Repair 9-1-1 Radio System*
- ◆ *Update: Jail Population*

A brief discussion took place regarding stipends for uniform allowance and what would be more cost effective.

Supervisor Westbrook motioned as a block to accept the bid for law enforcement uniforms and to award contract to Finger Lakes Communications for service and repair for the 911 radio system. Supervisor Bendzlowicz seconded the motion. Motion carried.

A brief discussion took place regarding the negotiation of price and the price increase for the communications service and repair.

Sheriff Povero reviewed the Jail population.

- Current - 158
- Weekend High - 161
- Females - 31
- Two pods are closed.
- Four minors are housed out.

A brief discussion took place regarding the jail pods and population, the needs and compliances with Sheriff Povero noting that the NYS Corrections is aware of their status.

Sheriff Povero made the Committee aware, with the homicide of the State Trooper in Steuben County, there will be no State Trooper Patrols in the County for Saturday and Sunday and the State Police respectfully asked to withdraw the troopers assigned to the concert Sunday night, to be able to participate in the funeral. He noted that this will affect the overtime scheduling.

Sheriff Povero updated the Committee on their drug investigations.

A full time SRO will be assigned to the Wayne Finger Lakes BOCES in Flint.

**COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR:**

- ◆ *Update*

Mary Krause noted the following updates:

- Supervisor Ingalsbe from the Town of Farmington is asking for a letter of support for their request from the Federal Highway Administration Transportation Funding to enable construction of sidewalks, handicapped accessible ramps, crossing signals and cross walks to connect areas within the

- Hamlet of Farmington. Chairman Green approved the request.
- Raise the Age - Continued review on what becomes available; regular meetings have been scheduled. Judge Doran is invited to attend the August 9<sup>th</sup> meeting. On Friday Sept 14<sup>th</sup> there will be a large session to report out what has information has been acquired before the October 1<sup>st</sup>. With Jeff Rougeux leading the task, they are required to present a financial plan in order to get any reimbursement of dollars.
  - Secured detention continues to be evaluated.
  - Blue Zones report will be presented on July 12<sup>th</sup>.
  - The Not for Profit Summit was on June 26<sup>th</sup> at FLCC; a thank you to FLCC and those 70 in attendance; noting it is a great forum for not for profit outreach.
  - Shared Services Panel met on June 28<sup>th</sup> noting the forum brought up other topics to pursue.
