PUBLIC HEALTH	
<i>a. Resolution: Authority to Renew Public Health Intermunicipal Mutual Aid Agreement</i>	<p>Public Health Director, Mary Beer, presented a resolution to renew the Public Health intermunicipal mutual aid agreements.</p> <p>Supervisor Teed motioned to approve the renewal of the Public Health intermunicipal mutual aid agreements. Supervisor Daryl Marshall seconded the motion. The motion carried.</p>
<i>b. Resolution: Authorization to Accept New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) Children with Special Health Care Needs</i>	<p>Public Health Director, Mary Beer, presented a resolution to accept funding from NYS for children with special health care needs.</p> <p>Supervisor Russell motioned to approve the acceptance of funding from NYS for children with special health care needs. The motion carried.</p> <p>The corrective action plan is being reviewed today. Ms. Beer hopes to hear within two weeks about how the review went.</p> <p>Public Health Director, Mary Beer, gave an update of the COVID-19 Pandemic, noting the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 382 Positive total cases • 0 New cases today • 0 Hospitalized • 0 New deaths • 7 People are being monitored • 36 People are under mandatory quarantines • Public Health is working with school and colleges • She thanked Code Enforcement Officials for doing the gym inspections <p>They have learned that most of the COVID deaths are contributed to people that already have underlying issues.</p> <p>Ms. Beer talked about opioid deaths and passed out information. In 2019 opioid deaths went down but 2020 they are on the rise.</p> <p>They are working on a plan for flu shots. From programing on getting more people to want to receive the flu shot and hosting a clinic on October 7th. This clinic will be held as a drive thru.</p>
MENTAL HEALTH	
<p><i>a. Resolution: Appointment of Director of Community Mental Health Services – Dr. Jessica D. Mitchell</i></p> <p><i>b. Updates</i></p>	<p>Mr. Young presented a resolution to appoint Dr. Jessica D. Mitchell as the Director of Community Mental Health Services.</p> <p>Supervisor Teed motioned to approve the appointment of Dr. Jessica Mitchell. Supervisor Russell seconded the motion. The motion carried.</p> <p>Ms. Johnston let the committee know that on Friday the telehealth reimbursements end. Many originations are pushing for this to continue as, this program has been beneficial for many people. Also, due to the reduction in reimbursements of the 730 monies, it has put a large strain on the mental health budget, as was expected. They will be bringing a resolution next committee to try to cover the deficit.</p>
OFFICE FOR THE AGING	
<p><i>a. Updates</i></p>	<p>Ms. Coveny noted that the food box distributions end today. Food link is looking to get back to their regular mobile food pantry distributions. OFA is still providing and delivering a lot of meals. They have had an increase of over 10,000 meals from last year. They are still looking for volunteers to deliver meals.</p>

DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES	
<i>a. Updates</i>	<p>Ms. Tiberio reported that they are still working on sorting out if they are going to have a 20% reduction in State funding. They have been receiving conflict information regarding the four different State funding sources they have. Thirteen members of her staff will be taking the retirement incentive.</p> <p>They will be starting to work on a new 2-year plan to end homelessness that the State is requiring the department to submit.</p> <p>The County has received money from the Emergency Solutions Grant funded by the CARES grant to help prevent evictions and rapid rehousing of people to prevent homelessness. She is sending this funding through FLACRA making them lead agency, and they will split the funding between different agencies. They are hoping to receive a second round of this funding when it is released.</p> <p>She has sent out a resource for help in difficult times and will be sending out an additional piece about evictions.</p>
YOUTH BUREAU	
<i>a. Updates</i>	<p>Ms. Foote noted that she was recently at a task force meeting called the Geneva 2030. They are group of agencies that support youth from cradle to career. They have asked her for a support letter to expand their services for 0-3 youths. She was happy to provide this for them.</p>
WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT	
<i>a. Updates</i>	<p>Ms. McGraw was able to provide placement for 29 youths through the summer youth employment program. This was more than she thought they were going to be able to do with COVID.</p>
INTERIM COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR	
<p><i>a. Resolution: Reappointment of Mary Beer – Director of Community Public Health</i></p> <p><i>b. Updates</i></p>	<p>Mr. Young presented a resolution to reappoint Mary Beer as the Director of Community Public Health.</p> <p>Supervisor Teed motioned to approve the reappointment of Mary Beer. We should be able to hold the October 1st Board meeting there. • 51 people have been granted the retirement incentive
