PUBLIC HEALTH	
<i>Update</i>	Public Health Director, Mary Beer, gave the following COVID19 updates: <ul style="list-style-type: none">● They are up to 518 cases● Five new positive cases today● Seneca Lake Terrace, assisted living facility is up to 15 positive cases● She is concerned that the numbers are going up.● There are clusters occurring● Things are well in control at Hobart and William Smith Colleges● Keuka College has a large outbreak of over 50 students● They received a letter from the Governors office; they will be providing a machine and supplies for rapid testing.● Brian Young noted, in our region, the positivity rate is at .8%, if it reaches 2%, there will be a close down.
CAMPBELL COMMISSION	
	Supervisor Todd Campbell reported the Commission met last week and focused primarily on the initiative for the police reform and reinvention collaborative. They will be meeting on October 15 th with the primary objective to confirm the questionnaire and materials to start distribution across the County in several different formats,

	<p>including social media. The current plan is to have open sessions for the public on October 28-30th, with three separate locations covering the east, west and central areas of the County. They will follow up with a another one virtually the following week. The locations are being finalized with FLCC Geneva Campus being a possibility, the Friday afternoon location will be at FLCC, and the third at Bloomfield Performing Arts Center. The virtual location will be held from 74 Ontario Street.</p>

They would like to amend the scope of services in the contract to finish with a revised schematic plan and complete an environmental review. They will get a clear definition of the boundaries of the County Home Cemetery. They will look at the existing range and make recommendations for some short-term improvements to the range. This will allow them to use what money they do have to spruce up the range. This will also allow them to be ready when funding does become available.</p>

	<p>Steve DeChick, Chief Communications Officer, reported they are up and operational on something they have been working on for two years. It is called ASAP (Automated Secure Alarm Protocol). As an example, when you enter into a subscription with ADP to monitor your alarms at home, the alarm is activated, it goes to the ADP monitoring center, they call the local center, and so they have an alarm and they call the fire department. Now they will have the ability to stop or eliminate the phone call from being made, because the alarm has activated the center. They are up and operational with a few alarm companies.</p>
