<i>Update</i>	Public Health Director, Mary Beer, gave the following COVID19 updates: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● 1,056 positive cases ● 8 in the hospital with no new deaths ● The Governor called out Victor possibly going yellow. ● Working on getting additional staff ● An explanation in the difference between isolation and quarantine was given ● They have a plan for a drive thru with the County's transportation center when the vaccine becomes available ● Brian Young noted that they will be creating two part time nurse positions and five student intern positions to assist the Public Health staff.

Resolution: <i>Authorization to Accept SFY2020-2021 Victim and Witness Assistance Program Grant – District Attorney's Office</i>	Mary Gates explained the resolution presented is a standard grant they get every year. Peter Brown explained this is the second year of the normal three to five-year contract. He said in the past 80% is for by the grant and 20% by the County. This year and probably next year the NYS Office of Victim Services has removed the in-kind requirement. For this resolution, the entire victim assistance program is funded for one year. There is no County cost associated this year.
