Dear Honeoye Lake Shoreline Landowner,

As summer approaches, Ontario County is preparing for the **2017 Honeoye Lake Aquatic Vegetation Management Program (AVMP)**. Below you will find information about the program and contact information. Also, enclosed is important information for shoreline property owners and others with **water lines extending into Honeoye Lake that could be affected by harvesting operations**.

HARVESTING GOALS

Harvesting operations are managed to meet two goals:

- 1) **Reduce nuisance vegetation** that impedes swimming, boating and other recreational uses of the lake.
- 2) **Remove nutrients** in excessive plant growth from the lake environment. Plants removed from Honeoye Lake via harvesting are transported away from the lake and used for compost on gardens and farms.

2017 HARVESTING OPERATIONS

Ontario County strives to adapt the harvesting program to dynamic lake conditions while maintaining lake access for residents and visitors. Below is our tentative schedule for operations.

WEEK OF	
June 26	Waterline Marking/Shoreline Collection Begins
July 3 – Sept 4	Shoreline Collection/Weed Harvesting
Sept 11	Weed Harvesting Ends
Oct 9	Shoreline Collection Ends

Operations occur Monday through Thursday, with effort generally split between Shoreline Collection (Monday and Thursday) and Harvesting (Tuesday and Wednesday). This schedule will vary based on weather and lake conditions. Harvesting will be targeted to areas outside the state wetland where plant growth is at or near the surface of the water. Residents who prefer to not have the harvester cut in front their shoreline should contact us to express and/or update their preferences. See contact information below.

With the help of volunteers, we use an aquatic vegetation mapping tool to guide our prioritization of areas to harvest. The shoreline barge will generally follow along previously harvested locations, modified based on where wind and current carry fragments to shore. If you find dense aquatic vegetation is making it hard for you to enjoy the lake, please contact us with your location and we will make every effort to accommodate you. The mapping tool is quite accurate, but your observations are important and can help us tailor the harvesting effort (more or less harvesting) based on your needs. In some cases, neighbors work together to develop consensus and communicate their shared preferences and needs via a single spokesperson, which is much appreciated.

WATERLINE INFORMATION

If you have a waterline in Honeoye Lake please see the important attached flyer! The County will arrange waterline marking for those unable to set their own markers (see enclosed flyer) on **June 27-28**, weather permitting.

AVMP STAFFING

Betsy Landre, Senior Planner for Ontario County remains the program manager. Operators **Randy DePew** and **Scott Strong** are returning as the operations team.

INFORMATION SHARING AND PROGRAM COMMUNICATION

DOCKS AND HARVESTING

Residents are reminded that the harvester cannot trim around docks as the machine is not designed to maneuver in such tight spaces. Residents interested in learning more about controlling weed growth around docks should contact us for ideas and information.

SHORELINE PICKUP OF FRAGMENTS

Fragments should be raked in loose piles or rows along shore. Residents should contact us by phone or email with an address and visual (from the water) description of the property. Our capacity is limited, so residents are asked to assist the crew when physically possible, which will allow us in turn to help more people. Those with gardens are encouraged to compost aquatic weeds on site.

RELATED ACTIVITIES

At times our staff will be involved in research, or assisting municipalities or the Sheriff's Dept. with other lake related projects. You may have seen the Sheriff's dive team training on the work barge on Honeoye Lake a few weeks ago.
