Updates</p>	<p>Public Health Director Mary Beer gave an update of the COVID-19 Pandemic, noting the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There was a community death last week. • They're at 35% of residents over 18 that have received a first dose of vaccine. • Hope to do a POD on site at Hobart and William Smith College when they open the eligibility. • The registrations are filling up a little slower.

<p>a. Updates</p>	<p>Irene Coveney's only update is that they have been working like crazy on registering for vaccines, partnering with Public Health. They were getting almost 50 calls a day. They have gotten over 1,000 people registered for the vaccine clinics. They have had volunteer staff assisting because it is so time consuming. Ms. Coveney also shared, they will be opening their meal programs in Shortsville and probably the Salvation Army in May and Honeoye too.</p>

a. Informational: <i>SSI contract Update</i>	Eileen Tiberio presented an update on one of their contracts with Catholic Charities. They have a case worker on site between the two sites to help people navigate the SSI process. She included a memo that shows the growth and the success rate of that contract.
b. <i>Updates</i>	<p>Ms. Tiberio noted the unaudited year end for 2020 budget; they will be returning about \$2.8 MM to the general fund. Their target is generally \$1MM because they never know what kind of unanticipated expenses will occur.</p> <p>They have contracted for some small short-term contracts for management consultant and training consultants in terms of getting teams working all in the same directions. It has been a productive collaboration and fortunately, the type of services are paid for by Empire State College collaborative.</p>

<i>Updates</i>	<p>Marsha Foote reported the following updates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • They are receiving nominations from all the school districts and community for the youth awards. • NYS has a Youth Council where they ask for each County to send a youth representative. She has someone in mind but is waiting for more information from the state on what she needs to do.

COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR	
	<p>Chris DeBolt gave the following updates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • For operational updates, there was not a report on any quarantine cases or positive employees last week. • They are beginning to talk to departments about returning to normalcy and bringing some employees back in. • Kudos to Mary Beer and her staff, Brian and the Board approving the purchase of structure. • Much of his time is being spent with the school districts working with them and helping them to understand that it is not the County's position to open schools, but the state. • Federal stimulus funding: American Rescue Plan (ARP), will be about \$21.5 MM, but the Treasury does not know when they will get the guidelines for the funds. They will need more clarity from the Federal Government. • They will be using the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) formula to get the monies to the Towns and Villages. <p>Cindy Allen, a resident of Ontario County, inquired on the bill for \$21.5 MM, asking if we understand what requirements and restrictions are going to be on the County to comply with all the demands. Mr. DeBolt said they understand what the demands, requirements, and eligible funding stream is outlined in the actual legislation are. The issue is the legislature has advocated their authority to an agency, in this point, the Department of Treasury to promulgate the specific rules and regulations pursuant to the overarching legislative goals.</p>
